



#### **Enrichment Classes- Spring 2024**

The following are Enrichment classes offered for Spring 2024. The form will open on Wednesday, December 13, 2023 and close on Monday, January 8, 2024. Classes will be paid for during registration through FACTS. Classes will close automatically if the maximum number of students is reached.

There are a limited number of spaces in each class. Enrollment is done on a first come, first serve basis. A minimum of 10 students is needed for a class to run. Classes will be canceled due to insufficient enrollment. If a class is canceled, parents will be notified by email and/or phone call. There are no refunds or proration of tuition once registered. Classes are not scheduled during school holidays, breaks, early dismissal days, or parent teacher conferences.

<u>Karate</u> is not included in the form. You must register with them directly for those classes. Please follow the contact information below their class description to register. If your child is in 3-5 on Wednesday's you will need to either use the dop-in for Extended Day or have a way to care for them between classes. Students CANNOT be unsupervised from end of school until 3:15pm.

- \*Due to the secondary school's different dismissal times if your child is in grades K-5 and in a class with a secondary teacher or in the secondary building, they will be collected by an Extended Day staff at 3:00pm and be given time to eat a snack before they are walked over to the secondary building.
