For K-5 Students: If your child is in grades K-5 and has a class that starts at 3:15, the Extended Day staff will hold them for snack and homework time, then walk them to their class. This applies to classes like Ceramics and Calligraphy.

For Grades 6-12 Students: If your student is in grades 6-12 and has a class in the Elementary building that starts at 3:15, they should walk over and join the class quietly. Elementary students in that class will start at 3:00. These classes include: Choir and DJ Basics.

Please sign your child up for classes they are interested in. We love having student's participate in our enrichment classes, but this can be difficult if a child has no interest in the activity. Please be mindful of the teachers' time and energy they put into all of these classes.
