Students will not be permitted to begin the program until all forms are received.

Percy Jackson: Camp Half-Blood

Welcome, future demigods! Get ready for an epic summer adventure inspired by Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief. Over the course of this summer program, students will step into the world of Greek mythology while building important skills. Through interactive lessons, creative projects, and hands-on activities, demigods will train their minds just like heroes at Camp Half-Blood.

In our ELA quests, demigods will journey through *The Lightning Thief* as they uncover powerful themes, identify important literary devices, and strengthen vocabulary by exploring Greek root words that still shape the English language today. Reading, writing, and discussion activities will help students think deeply about characters, conflicts, and messages within the story.

In Math training, demigods will sharpen their problem-solving skills by mastering operations with mixed fractions. Math challenges and games will be woven into each week's adventures, helping students build confidence, accuracy, and perseverance while tackling increasingly complex problems.

The adventure culminates in a final project worthy of Mount Olympus: students will design and create a museum exhibit focused on a Greek god or goddess featured in *The Lightning Thief*. Demigods will research their chosen deity and bring their learning to life through models, visuals, and written explanations—combining creativity, knowledge, and presentation skills.

Throughout the course, students will collaborate with fellow demigods, practice communication and teamwork, and engage in project-based learning that makes academics exciting and meaningful. With plenty of hands-on experiences, interactive lessons, and heroic challenges along the way, this summer program promises an unforgettable journey.

The Hunger Games:

Entering Grade: 6 - 8

In this engaging 3-week summer class, students will explore *The Hunger Games* by Suzanne Collins and uncover what makes dystopian stories so powerful. Through guided reading and discussion, students will analyze how authors build chilling worlds, develop compelling heroes like Katniss Everdeen, and explore themes of power, survival, and the influence of media.

Students will use these ideas as inspiration to create their own original dystopian short stories, designing unique worlds, conflicts, and characters while strengthening their reading, writing, and critical-thinking skills.





Mixed Media Makers:

Entering Grade: 4 - 6

Session 1 & 2 - Instructor: *Lorena Jones*

In this hands-on, three-week creative studio, students in grades 4–6 will explore the world of crafting, fiber art, fashion, design and more through sewing, weaving, jewelry making, printing/painting, and wearable art. Young designers will learn both hand sewing and sewing machine basics, while experimenting with materials like ribbon, yarn, string, a variety of fabrics and recycled materials.

Throughout the course, students will dive into short, engaging lessons on fashion and art history, discovering how clothing and textiles have been used across cultures to tell stories, express identity, and spark creativity. These mini lessons will inspire students as they design and create their own unique pieces.

Projects may include bag charms, woven fiber art, jewelry made from recycled materials, tote bags, and simple garments, allowing students to build skills step by step while expressing their individual style. Emphasis is placed on creativity, sustainability, and confidence, with plenty of opportunities for choice and experimentation.

By the end of the three weeks, students will have a collection of handmade projects, and the pride that comes from learning new skills, problem-solving, and bringing their ideas to life. No prior sewing experience needed, just curiosity and creativity!

By exploring these texts, students will learn to:

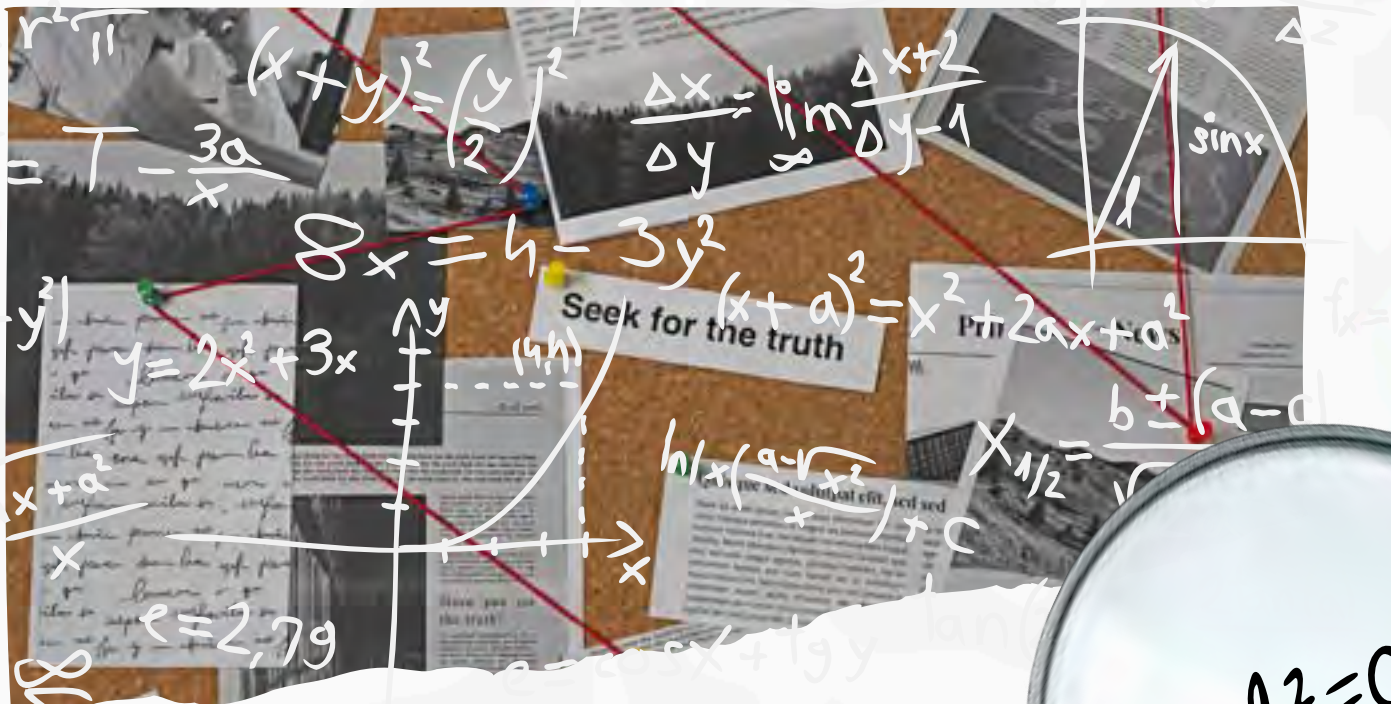
- **Read with Purpose:** Analyze how authors use "voice" to make us laugh, cry, or stay on the edge of our seats.

Through constant practice and repetition of our sleuthing strategies in both Nonfiction and Pre-Algebra, our Detectives will be more confident and effective readers and problem solvers who are ready to tackle any text or algebraic equation that comes their way.

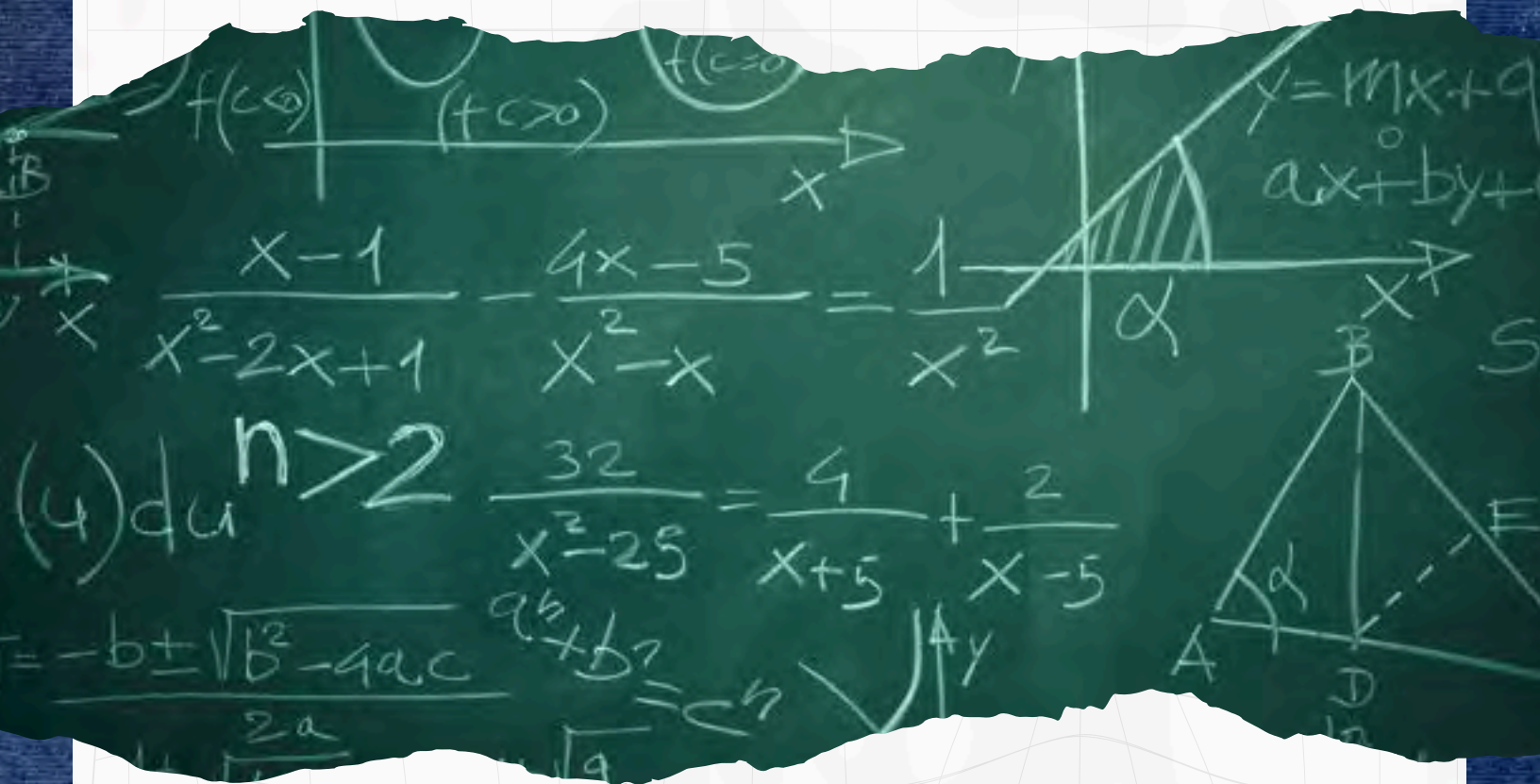
Middle School Transition: Bridging English and Math:

By the end of this course, students will have the confidence to tackle higher-level math without being slowed down by foundational gaps.

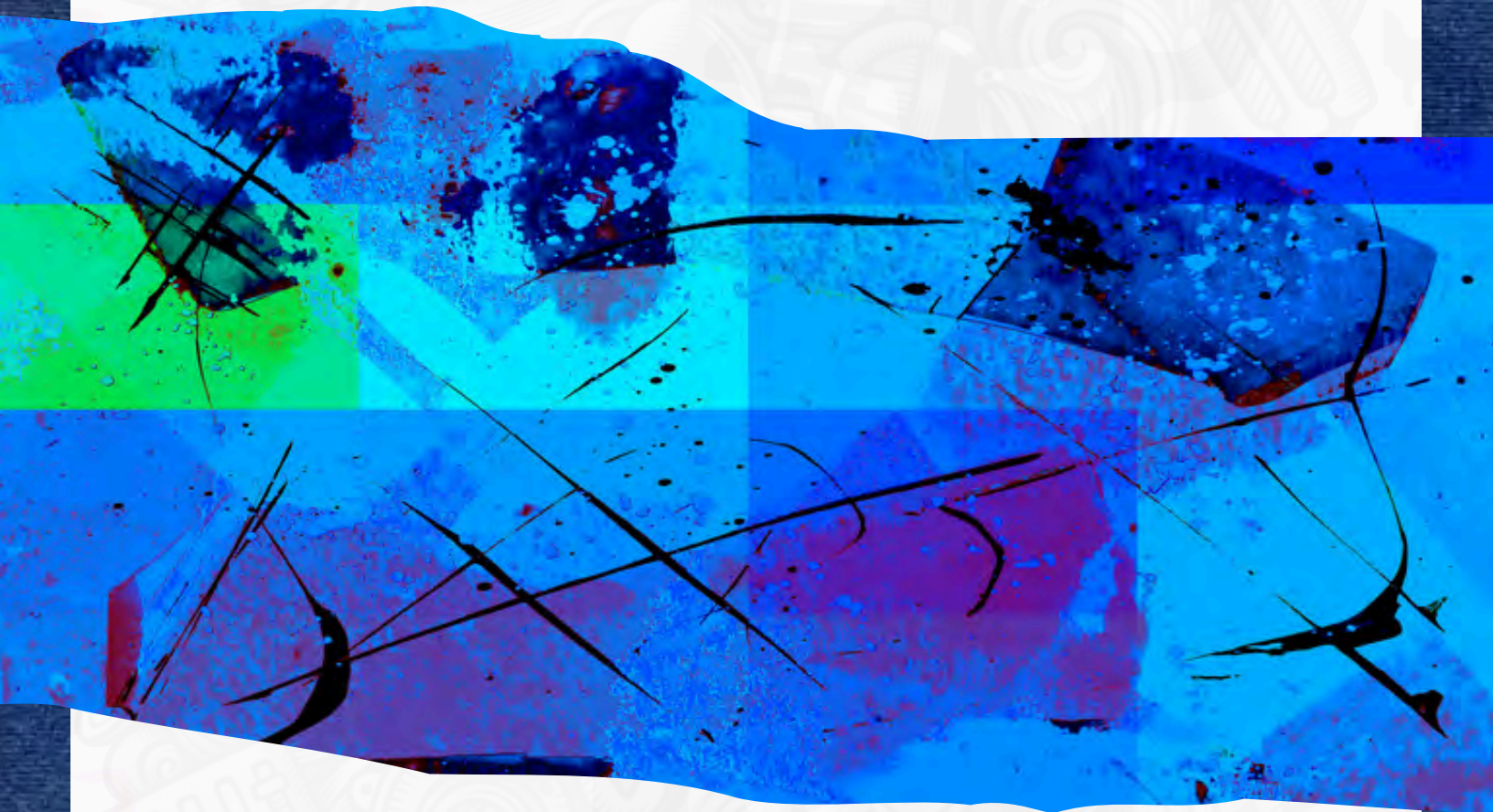
Creative Fusion: Art, Movement and Media
